Entry Details

1. Online Entries
 - Available on the ShowDay website
 - Online entries must be paid for via credit card
2. Mail-In Entries
 - The form for mail-in entries can be found at the back of the schedule
 - Payment can be made by cheque (to Hawkesbury District Agricultural Association), or credit card ONLY. (*CASH IS NOT ACCEPTED THROUGH MAIL*).
3. Entries Close
 - Both mail-in and online entries will close at 6:00 pm on Friday, 10th April 2026
4. Late Entries
 - No late entries will be accepted
 - Please refer to the Cattle Committee email or committee member contact details for any assistance required prior to the entry closing date
5. Prize Money
 - Prize money won during the Show will be paid by Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) to the account details provided to the Chief Steward during the show
 - If the bank details provided are incomplete or incorrect, HDAA will take all reasonable efforts to contact prize winners to confirm payment details
 - HDAA seeks to finalise all prize money payments by the end of May

What's New for the 2026 Hawkesbury Cattle Section

The Hawkesbury Cattle Committee is excited to introduce several new additions to the cattle schedule for 2026, offering fresh opportunities for exhibitors, schools, and spectators to participate and enjoy the program.

‘Golden Oldies’ Paraders’ Competition

A fun and good-spirited new class for our experienced cattle handlers!

- Open to participants over 25 years of age
- Exhibitors and spectators may nominate a participant for a \$5 buy-in
- The nominated handler may:
 - Parade the animal, OR
 - Pay a **\$10 buy-out** fee to avoid parading!
- Individuals may be nominated **up to 5 times**
- Participants **must be physically capable of parading an animal** and have prior parading experience.
- Buy-ins and outs will require **cash on the day** to the cattle office.
- Held on **Saturday, 25th April**, before the lunch break.

Come and have a laugh, support your favourite handlers, and enjoy a light-hearted competition that celebrates long-time cattle show supporters.

Led Commercial Breeders Class

A fantastic new class supporting the commercial side of the industry. This class provides schools and exhibitors with the opportunity to:

- Exhibit **commercial females not registered with any breed society**
- Receive feedback and assessment in a formal show environment
- Participate alongside stud exhibitors in a recognised competition

This class will be judged on **Sunday, 26th April**, in the morning and is open to animals that do not meet stud breed registration requirements.

Conditions of Entry & Exhibition

1. Breeds will be judged as per the program: European, British, Tropical and Small
2. Breed and age MUST be stated on the entry form. The age of the exhibit is taken as of the 1st April 2026.
3. No animal under 9 months may be entered in its own class; the exhibit must be shown on its dam.
4. All cattle must be on the grounds by 6:30 pm, Saturday, 25th April 2026.
5. All cattle must be fully prepared by 8:30 am on the day of judging and must remain on the grounds until 4:30 pm.
6. Exhibitors travelling over 200 km may request an exemption to amend departure time, but this MUST be noted on the entry form and approved by the committee prior to the show. Early departure requests will not be considered on the day of the show, and exhibitors/exhibits will have to remain on the grounds until 4:30 pm.
7. Bedding for animals is NOT provided. Exhibitors must supply their own bedding.
8. All cattle must arrive with a National Livestock Identification System (NLIS) tag already attached to the animal. Any animals arriving without this will not be allowed to be unloaded onto the showground property.
9. All exhibits must be free of infectious diseases.
10. Bulls 12 months and over must be fitted with a nose ring.
11. Bulls under 12 months must be led with a bulldog grip.
12. Bulls must be adequately supervised to the satisfaction of the stewards to ensure that they do not pose a danger to the general public.
13. All females must be led with a bulldog grip.
14. The Cattle Committee's decision is final in all matters related to this schedule and the exhibition of cattle. The Chief Steward and Committee reserve the right to refuse entries and to change, merge, or remove classes where necessary.
15. All stock must be adequately supervised for the duration of the Show.
16. No entries will be accepted on the day.
17. The following documents must accompany each entry:
 - a. Breed certificate for each animal (except commercial exhibits). All registered cattle must comply with the regulations of the relevant Breed Society.
 - b. Property health declaration.
 - c. Negative pestivirus test for each exhibit.

18. All persons in the Cattle Area, including exhibitors and assistants, must complete a “Risk Warning” Indemnity/Waiver form:

- a. The form is available at the end of this schedule or on the Show website
- b. Forms MUST be completed at the Cattle Office if not submitted in advance
- c. A wristband will be issued upon submission and must be worn when taking part in cattle activities
- d. Exhibitors under 18 years old must have the form signed by a parent or guardian

Documents required under Clauses 17 and 18 must be submitted by 4:00 pm on Friday, 10th April 2026 to hdaa.cattle@gmail.com, or posted in hard copy to reach the HDAA Office by 6:00 pm the same day

Additional information that must be stated on the entry form:

1. Day of arrival
2. If stalling is requested next to a specific exhibitor.
3. Whether an entry pass is required for a transport carrier (see below)

Additional Exhibitor Information

Grand Parade

All ribbon winners from Saturday's judging must participate in the Grand Parade at 1:00 pm. All exhibitors are strongly encouraged to parade their animals. A \$100 cash prize will be awarded for the "Best Cattle Exhibit on Parade".

Transport Carriers

To enable free entry of stock carriers, exhibitors must apply as part of their entry for a carrier gate pass. Carrier details and delivery/collection days must be supplied, as passes are barcoded and date-specific. Passes will be sent to exhibitors, who are responsible for ensuring carriers have them. Without a valid pass, carriers will be charged at the gate.

Carriers must enter via Gate 3 and leave immediately after unloading. Exhibitors are asked to be considerate so that as many competitors as possible may be housed under cover.

Animal Welfare Policy

The Hawkesbury District Agricultural Association (HDAA) is committed to ensuring the welfare and proper treatment of all animals on the Showground. Exhibitors must care for their animals in accordance with the Animal Welfare Policy. Breaches may result in removal from the grounds and/or referral to the RSPCA.

Exhibitors and attendants must take all reasonable steps to ensure appropriate animal care, noting that the public is present throughout the day. Animal welfare includes, but is not limited to:

1. Suitable housing
2. Appropriate management
3. Adequate nutrition
4. Responsible care
5. Humane handling
6. Veterinary treatment

Hoof & Hook Competition

Conditions of Entry

1. The decision of Stewards on all matters pertaining of incidental to the competition shall be final, conclusive and binding on all nominations for the competition.
2. The Committee reserves unto itself the right at any time, without being liable, for any loss or damage which may be sustained.
3. The Committee will not be responsible for any damage, accident, loss or death pertaining to the competition.
4. All cattle must have a National Livestock Identification System (NLIS) tag fitted prior to arrival on the Showground. All cattle will be scanned upon arrival to the Showground.
5. All cattle must have tested negative to pestivirus, and test results must be submitted with entries along with a health declaration.
6. All exhibitors must sign and lodge a Risk Warning/Indemnity & Health Declaration.
7. All cattle must be free of infectious disease.
8. All exhibits must have a management tag to identify them for judging.
9. All exhibits must be transported to Hawkesbury Showground to be judged live in either the led or unled hoof section of the competition. Cattle transported directly to the processor without participating in the live hoof judging will not be accepted as part of the hook competition and consequently disqualified.
10. All cattle will be subsequently transported to Certified Meat Co (Wilberforce) upon completion of live judging.
11. All exhibits will be sold to Certified Meat Co over the current grid price for that week, unless prior arrangements (e.g. personal use) have been organised.
12. Cattle entered into the unled section must be docile enough to be safely handled throughout the weighing, judging and transportation process. Cattle that pose a risk or danger to themselves, other exhibits and the Committee/exhibitors, due to temperament issues, will be disqualified at the discretion of the Chief Steward. Following disqualification, the exhibitor will be required to make their own arrangements to transport the animal off the Showground.
13. All cattle entered in the Hoof and Hook Competition must fall within the liveweight range of 360 – 480kg, with a 5 kg allowance on either side.

14. Any cattle that exceed the liveweight limit will be moved into the Led Commercial Competition or disqualified and will not be eligible to participate.
15. If the animal is deemed ineligible for the competition, then the exhibitor/s of the cattle must make other arrangements.
16. All led cattle must be restrained by nose ring or nose grip.
17. The use of Hormone Growth Promotants (HGPs) are not permitted for this competition
18. Stewards may use their discretion and refuse any entry to an animal deemed to be unfit for competition i.e. temperament, weight, health or specifications.

Competition Details

- Live judging on Sunday 26th April, starting with led cattle at approximately 9:00 am, followed by unled classes.
- All cattle entered in Hoof and Hook competition must be on the grounds by 10:00 pm on Saturday night, 25th April.
- Carcase presentation and a sausage sizzle with light refreshments will be announced on the Hawkesbury Show Cattle Section Facebook Page, and entrants will be notified.

HDAA and Certified Meat Co have entered into an agreement that all funds pertaining to carcase sales will be paid to the HDAA within 28 business days of processing of the cattle. Following the receival of the funds the HDAA will then pay out exhibitors within 14 business days.
